PRESENTATION 1:

VOIP Fraud - Scott A. McIntyre

ABSTRACT:

As the world's telecoms companies shift away from traditional technologies and move towards an all-ip infrastructure, fraudsters and organised criminals have already figured out how best to profit from this new technology. Voice over IP offers potentially massive benefits to consumers and businesses, but the inherent risks the technology brings about has already resulted in massive financial impact for those in a rush to implement without considering the implications. Understanding the trade-off of 'customer friendly' versus 'fraud friendly' is essential before deploying VoIP infrastructure.

This talk will cover actual case studies that one provider has worked through in investigating a variety of VoIP abuse and fraud scenarios, the problems dealing with law enforcement and the impact to the customer and overall business model as they struggle to merge the old- world and new in this emerging technological standard.

SPEAKER'S BIO:

Scott A. McIntyre currently sits on the Board of Directors and Steering Committee of the Forum of Incident Response and Security Teams, the longest established community for computer security incident handlers. For the last 9 years he's served as Chief Security Officer for XS4ALL Internet, the oldest ISP in The Netherlands and also serves as one of the 5 kernel members for the KPN (Royal Dutch Telecom) Computer Emergency Response Team. In 2007 Scott was appointed to the ITU's High Level Expert Group to help provide input into computer security initiatives from the Incident Response and ISP communities to the ITU's ongoing efforts in this area. A frequent speaker at computer security events around the world, Scott's often humorous insight into operational computer security events provide glimpses into the darker side of the Internet whilst reminding us that the Good Guys are still out there doing their best to keep the Internet safe.

PRESENTATION 2:

Lockpicking - Walter Belgers

ABSTRACT:

Lockpicking is the art and science of opening locks without the key and without force (but with consent of the owner). In the lecture Walter will explain just why it is that picking locks is possible. He will describe the basic technique, but also pickguns and bumping. He will look into several techniques that manufacturers use to make lockpicking harder.

SPEAKER'S BIO:

Walter Belgers is Principal Security Consultant and Partner at Madison Gurkha, a Dutch firm specialised in technical IT security. He regularly performs security audits (ethical hacking), but also gives courses (security awareness, forensics) and occasionally performs social engineering. Walter founded the Eindhoven chapter of TOOOL, the Open Organisation of Lockpickers, based in the Netherlands. He has a tendency to win the yearly club championships.
